First documentary about West Virginia's Capitol premieres March 6

Charleston, W.Va. – The premiere screening of the first documentary about West Virginia's Capitol is being held at an invitation-only showing March 6 at the Cultural Center, State Capitol Complex in Charleston. MotionMasters, a Charleston film and video production company, produced *A Moving Monument: The West Virginia State Capitol* in partnership with the University of Charleston and will present it for the first time on Thursday. The documentary makes its broadcast debut on March 13.
